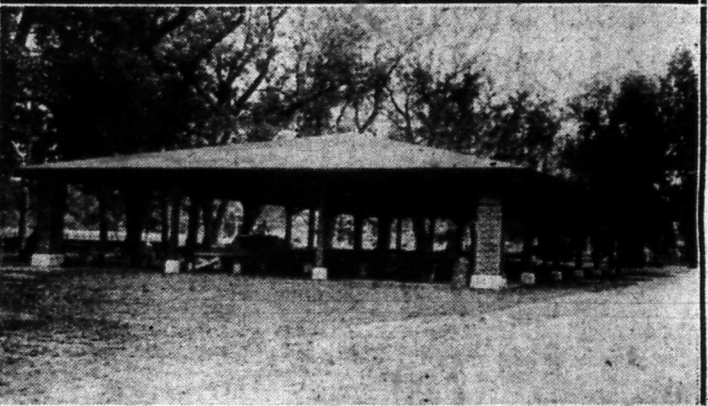
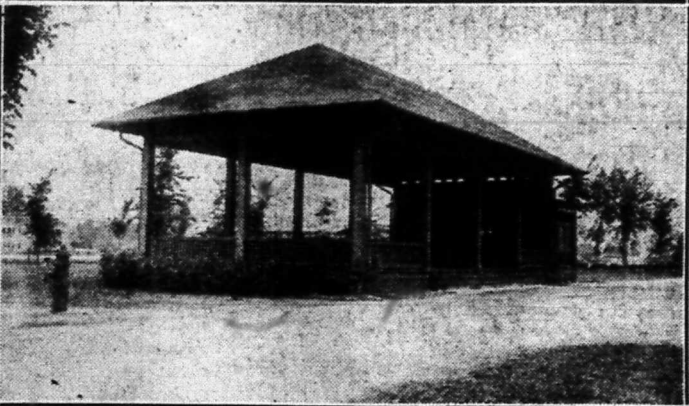
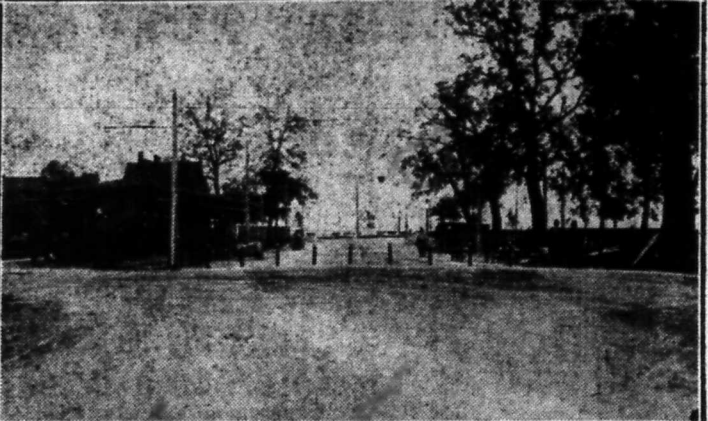
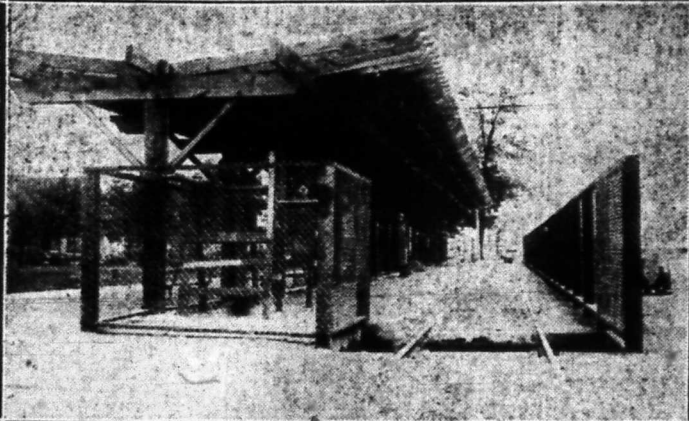
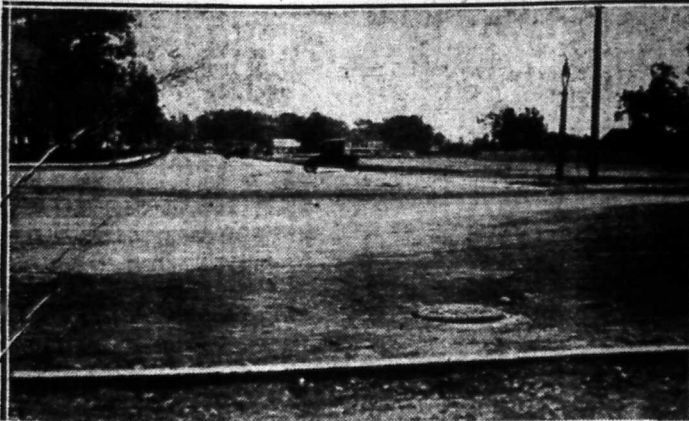


Many Improvements Made at Ontario Beach Park, Soon To Attract Summer Crowds

Upper left—One of the new automobile parking spaces. View taken of east side of Lake Avenue, looking down Beach Avenue towards the River. Upper right—Another place to leave your car. This parking space is on the southwest corner of Lake and Beach Avenues.

Center left—New loading platform of the New York State Railways. Tickets must be bought before boarding the cars and the "single file" rule will be rigidly enforced. Those trying to sneak in the wrong way will find themselves in a neatly built tank of water which crosses the tracks in front of the place where the car stops.

Center right—No more will the automobilist be permitted to drive his car down to the end of Lake Avenue to the sand's edge. It begins to look as though the auto-bathing parties will be ended, for no automobile will be allowed north of Beach Avenue this year.

Lower left—New ice cream stand, erected in the park for the accommodation of those who take their lunches and want a cool refreshment.

Lower right—One of two new picnic pavilions erected in the park. These are furnished with tables and benches and are for the free use of all picnickers.

Bottom center—The usual row of benches fronting the sand beach will appear for the mothers, who bring their children for a day's outing.

PINCHOT CASH SEEN AS BLOW AT PRIMARIES

Expenditure of \$120,000 Cited as Argument for Return to Old-time Convention.

Washington, June 3.—Opponents of the primary system in Washington, and there is an ever increasing number of them, have seized upon the Pinchot and Pepper expenditures in Pennsylvania as arguments in furtherance of their campaign for a return to the old convention plan of nominating candidates for high public office.

There is no suggestion, even in the most partisan quarters, that illegitimate use was made of any money in
